

Nouns – IIB1

Many nouns can be grouped into categories of “People,” “Animals,” “Places,” and “Things.” Sort the nouns in this packet into the correct categories.

Nouns – IIB2

Common nouns name any person, place, thing or idea. They are not capitalized. Proper nouns are the names of specific people, places, things, or ideas. Proper nouns should always be capitalized. Sort the nouns in this packet in the correct categories.

Nouns – IIB3

Concrete nouns can be perceived with the five senses. Abstract nouns are things that cannot be seen, smelled, heard, or touched. Abstract nouns can be emotions or concepts. Sort the nouns in this packet in the correct categories.

Note to teacher: There are four noun boxes beginning with Roman Numeral II. Roman Numeral I is a set of words from all parts of speech learned in the previous grammar lessons—the “Function of Words.”

Instructions: Print out the following cards on card stock with a color printer. Each succeeding page should be printed on the back of the preceding page and is meant to keep the different sets together.

The sets were designed to fit inside the Montessori grammar boxes.
